BACKGROUND & **PROJECT** DESCRIPTION

Today we face hugely increased number of humanitarian crisis, caused by conflicts, disasters and climate change. On behalf of the increased variations of such challenge, "Steps Towards Humanitarian Action" is a training course with two stages, aiming to uncover and analyze the ways how young people can lead and drive solutions in humanitarian action, among vouth workers. young professionals and volunteers coming from EU and EECA region.

Today, half the global population is under 30 years old. That is more young people than ever before. And more than 600million of them, a group larger than the entire population of the European Union, live in fragile and conflict-affected settings. Every day, we see news reports and devastating images of people affected by crises trying to survive, fleeing conflict or coping with natural disasters. We are witnessing more frequent and severe natural disasters, driven in part by climate change.

The breaking point from crisis to its transformation lays on the analysis of the ways of involvement. Raising awareness and prioritizing on how we can tackle the issue, can be a key towards problemsolving. If given a chance, the world's young people can help lead the way forward, from early preparedness to disaster riskreduction, to emergency response, to rehabilitation and recovery. Young women and men are driving innovative, creative solutions and insights into humanitarian crises. They are the best adapted to/in social technology, enabling them to mobilize efforts at local levels.

Young people can be seen as key partners in emergencies and protracted crises, for example in the United Nations Security Council Resolution on Youth, Peace & Security and the Compact on Young People in Humanitarian Action signed at the World Humanitarian Summit (2016). The time is now to support population to create more peaceful and resilient societies in the face of increasing disasters and uncertainty. We should challenge negative power dynamics and engage with them more strategically in humanitarian action, to drive solutions and contribute in the transformation of societies.

On behalf of the increased variations of humanitarian crisis, **"Steps Towards Humanitarian Action"** is a training course with two stages, aiming to uncover and analyze the ways how young people can lead and drive solutions in humanitarian action, among youth workers, young professionals, volunteers and trainers coming from EU and EECA region.

PROJECT AIMS TO:

The training course is based on non-formal education principles and will be prepared by qualified trainers, to share maximum of their experience in the field, in order to help participants to use gained knowledge and practical skills farther in their work. - raise awareness about humanitarian response to conflict and disaster;

- promote youth capacity building and share best practices in humanitarian settings;

prioritize the rights, participation and leadership of young people;

- discover how young people can lead and drive solutions in humanitarian action;

- analyze key lessons for meaningful engagement of young people in humanitarian response;

- support the engagement of young people throughout the key stages of the humanitarian cycle;

 explore the tools of enabling humanitarian access to populations in need, such as refugees/asylum seekers and migrants;

- provide a space for experience exchange;

- empower participants to use new competences farther in their target groups.

STAGE 1ST, TRAINING COURSE IN GEORGIA DATE: APRIL 7-13

During the first phase of the project, participants will be introduced key principles and concepts underlying humanitarian action and actors in the field of humanitarian response, strategic elements, current issues and challenges facing humanitarian sector. This stage will also cover essentials humanitarian inquiries, conflict response and peace-building, cultural dimension, people under risk and response management.

STAGE 2ND, TRAINING COURSE IN MALTA ESTIMATED DATE: AUTUMN

After providing content and theoretical aspects, during second stage participants will be involved in capacity building and problem-solving activities, interdisciplinary learning frameworks, simulation and risk assessment workshops of the humanitarian programme.

Overall, the project will introduce participants to humanitarian action approaches, give them an opportunity for cooperation and networking, encourage to work in different settings. Participants will be able to gain new experience for personal and professional development in the field and will have the opportunity to see which areas would best fit their strengths farther.
